Philip read French and Spanish at Leeds University where he gained a first (with distinction) before completing his PhD on the work of Baudrillard and Derrida at Bristol University and the Ecole Normale Supérieure, Paris. He completed his GDL at City University where he held both City University and Harmsworth Scholarships. He went on to win the Sachs Prize for his performance on the BVC where he was again a Harmsworth Scholar of the Middle Temple.

Philip's practice encompasses the full range of chancery and related commercial fields and his time is divided between advising, drafting (non-contentious and contentious) and litigating. He has particular expertise in real property matters (including trusts of land and mortgages), wills, probate and the administration of trusts and estates (including family provision), partnership disputes, personal insolvency, and landlord and tenant (business, agricultural and residential).

Philip regularly appears in the County Court and High Court and his recent appearances include a seven day trial involving trust property and conspiracy to defraud and a four day trial involving the existence of a partnership, ownership of agricultural land and equitable accounting (both without a leader). Philip has also appeared without a leader in the Court of Appeal on behalf of Lloyd's Names on a Taylor v Lawrence application and on three substantive appeals from decisions to debar Lloyd's Names from pleading misfeasance in public office.
